Program Description

The current crane truck has reached the end of its life cycle, the crane is also at the end of life and has been rebuilt multiple times. Replacing the current truck and crane with a larger truck and crane will allow servicing some challenging pump stations that currently would be hired out. As per the budget for 2024-2025 the department of Public Works went out to tender for a new 1-ton crane truck. One submission was received but was over budget and the tender was cancelled.

The risk of not replacing this truck with the larger 1-ton; is an increased operating cost when hiring out the work to an outside agency. Also, there would be a delay in response times waiting for the outside agencies to mobilize, leading to maintenance not being completed in a timely manner. There is a danger of a hired crane not being available in an emergency breakdown.

The current Blue International Tandem Dump Truck is not well suited to operating in off-road conditions experienced at the landfill. Its low clearance makes the tandem trucks more susceptible to tire and undercarriage damage (e.g., material wrapping around the drive shaft), They require 5-10 hours a week of maintenance just to address this damage.

ARTs are designed to work in heavy duty environments such as mines and landfills. The undercarriage is higher and designed for off-road conditions (e.g., resist small boulders). It is also better able to operate in wet, soft soil conditions and the tires are designed to resist puncture damage.

The need to replace this unit was originally identified during the 2024-2025 budget process as it is nearing the end of its useful life.

Discussions with the Director of Solid Waste, the KMEMC Site Supervisor, and Fleet Manager have concluded that a 16-tonne excavator is undersized and thus no longer adequate for safe and efficient use for key operations (e.g., cover and waste placement) at KMEMC.

Staff's analysis indicates that the existing 16-ton excavator adversely impacts the overall efficiency of cover placement operations (a key regulatory requirement) including truck loading times, equipment downtime for placing cover at the landfill working face, and the amount of operator time needed to complete soil hauling and placement operations.
