

Who is Cermaq Canada

- Campbell River, on north Vancouver Island
- We have a secondary office in Tofino, BC, as well as a warehouse in Port McNeill.
- We have 25 salmon farm licences on both the east and west coast of Vancouver Island
- We operate four hatcheries (one is located north of Campbell River, one is in Port Alberni, one is just south of Duncan, and one is just south of Courtenay)
- We own and operate a processing plant in Tofino
- We contract with a local processor just north of Campbell River for processing services on the east coast of the Island
- We have between 250 and 300 employees, depending on harvest activity

Expanding our business into Nova Scotia – the opportunity

- Cermaq Canada is looking at the possibility of growing our business in to Nova Scotia by approximately 20,000 metric tonnes
- This would require up to 20 farm sites, up to four hatcheries, two processing plants and marine infrastructure
- This would create between 250 and 300 well-paid jobs and careers in rural, coastal communities
- We plan to add value to the region by looking for opportunities to partner with local industry and businesses the Mi'kmaq of Nova Scotia, and existing commercial fisheries
- If approved, this expansion would effectively double our Canadian operations

Community focused and people first


- Our employees come from various countries, backgrounds and beliefs, but we all share one thing – a passion for our salmon and a desire to provide healthy, sustainable food for generations
- In BC, we have between 250 300 employees
- Approximately 50 full-time seasonal positions are based at our processing plants, which are tied to our harvest schedule
- This allows our processing employees more flexibility than our year-round scheduled positions at locations like our farms or offices
- Many of our processing employees have other responsibilities such as commercial fishing, seasonal work or other commitments
- On average, we have about 50 office-based roles, including the executive leadership team, who support the approximately 250 farm and warehouse based employees.






Community focused and people first



What does a typical farm look like?

- A total of 10 to 14 net cages (an average of 12 per farm site)
- 168 metre polar circles
- Feed barge and automated feeding system
- Ability to accommodate fishing activities in and around our farms and anchoring
- Benthic feasibility and modeling will be part of our overall feasibility scope


Our farms are low profile, making them less visible from a distance












St. Margaret's Bay Option to Lease Area





Mahone Bay Option to Lease Area




